#### HERLANDS NEW HEAD OF ORTHODOX CONGREGATIONS



William B. Herlands, former New York City Commissioner of Investigation, has been elected President of the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations of America, succeeding Dr. Samuel Nirenstein. Under the leadership of Mr. Heflands, UOJCA, which now includes over 500 synagogues, will embark on a nationwide campaign to unite all orthodox congregations in a program to infuse all realms of American Jewish life with the Torah spirit. At 43, William B. Herlands is be-

lieved to be the youngest man to head a Jewish congregational body of national scope, Founded in 1898 by Dr. H. Pereira Mendes, UOJCA is now celebrating its Golden Jubilee.


