FROM YOUR RABBI

This month has a special significance for the Jewish people. For in this month we celebrate the rededication of the Sanctuary in Jerusalem by Judah Maccabee, and the re-acquisition of our land, granted to us through the United Nations. We also celebrate, in Mount Carmel, the establishment of our Congregation over fifty years ago, and the building of our own little sanctuary twenty-five years ago. There are no words more appropriate on the occasion of our quadruple rejoicing, than the prayer of Solomon upon the dedication of the first House of G—d:

O Lord, the G-d of Israel, there is no god like thee, in the heavens above, and on the earth beneath, thou who keepest the covenant and the kindness for thy servants who walk before thee with all their heart who hast done for thy servant David, my father, what thou hadst promised him; and thou spokest with thy mouth and hast fulfilled it with thy hand, as it is this day. And now, O Lord, the G-d of Israel, keep for thy servant David, my father, what thou hast spoken concerning him, saying, There shall never fail thee a man in my sight that sitteth on the throne of Israel; if thy children but take heed to their way to walk before me, as thou hast wa'ked before me. And now, O G-d of Israel I pray thee, let thy word be verified, which thou hast spoken to thy servant David, my father. For in truth, will G-d then dwell on the earth? Beho d, the heavens and the heavens of heavens cannot contain thee, how much less then this house which I have built. Yet wilt thou turn thy regard unto the prayer of thy servant and to his supplication O Lord, my G-d, to listen to the entreaty and to the prayer which thy servant prayeth before thee today; that thy eyes may be open toward this house night and day, toward the place of which thou hast said, My name shall be there; that thou mayest listen to the prayer which thy servant shall pray at this place. And listen thou to the supplication of thy servant and of thy people Israel which they will pray at this place; and do thou hear in heaven, thy dwelling place, hear and forgive .

When thy people Israel are struck down before the enemy, because they have sinned against thee and they return then to thee and con ess thy name and pray, and make supplication

unto thee in this house, then do thou hear in heaven and forgive the sin of thy people Israel, and cause them to return to the land which thou hast given to their fathers.....

If thy people go out to battle against their enemy, on the way on which thou mayest send them, and they do pray unto the Lord in the direction of the city which thou hast chosen and of the house that I have built for thy name, then hear thou in heaven their prayer and their supplication and procure them justice. If they sin against thee, for there is no man that may not sin, and thou be angry with them and give them up to their enemy, so that their captors carry them away captive unto the land of the enemy, far or near . . . and they return unto thee with all their heart and with all their soul in the land of their enemies who have led them away captive, and they pray unto thee in the direction of their land, which thou hast given unto their fathers, of the city which thou hast chosen, and of the house which I have built for thy name, then hear thou in heaven, the place of thy dwelling, their prayer and their supplication and procure them justice; and forgive thy people for what they have sinned against thee and all their transgressions whereby they have transgressed against thee, and cause them to find mercy before their captors, that they may have mercy on them. For they are thy people and thy heritage whom thou hast brought forth out of Egypt, from the midst of the iron furnace for thou hast separated them unto thee as a heritage from a'l the people of the earth, as thou spokest by the hand of Moses, thy servant, when thou broughtest forth our fathers out of Egypt, O Lord Eternal.
